Requirements for articles

Language of Publications – Russian or English.

Volume – around 40 000 characters with spaces (including tables, figures, graphs, photos).

Text – in Word format. Tables can be placed inside the text or after it in one file. The list of illustrations can be in the end of the text as well as in the separate file.

Photos - in jpg or tiff (not less than 300 dpi) must be adyded in separate files each one (Please, DO NOT PUT photos or graphic illustrations inside the text-file!). The number of illustrations is not limited, but we are asking authors to offer a reasonable number of them. The illustrations can be black-white as well as color (graphical and photos) ones, but the final amount of color pictures editorial board will determine in accordance with the technical and financial capabilities.
